On the Trail

In the Fall 1997 issue of this newsletter, then FOW president and Wapack Trail Guide author John Flanders wrote: "The Wapack Range is the largest remaining high-altitude natural area in southern New Hampshire. Development pressure is again strong. Now is the time for all conservationist to turn their attention to the Wapack Range." The development pressure is stronger than ever today. It takes many individuals and organizations, working together, to

Friends of the Wapack Trail Workdays

For 2005 we have a number of interesting workdays scheduled. The workdays play a key part in making the Wapack Trail what it is. They are designed to supplement the work of the trail captains and to accomplish tasks beyond what is expected of the trail captains. For those of you who may not have the time to volunteer to be a trail captain, they provide an opportunity to give something back to the trail. I urge you to show up for one of the workdays and see how much fun it is. You'll probably get dirty and sweaty, but I can assure you that you'll feel a sense of accomplishment at the end of the day.

All workdays are on Saturday and start at 8:30 AM and typically wind down around 3:00 or 4:00 in the afternoon. Bring lunch, water, work clothes, and enthusiasm. We supply the tools and encouragement.

Saturday April 30: Temple Mountain Relocation Part II. Last fall we did a relocation at the summit of Temple Mountain. This spring we'll be

working at the foot of the mountain relocating a section of trail to drier ground. Park at the old Temple Mountain ski area parking lot on Route 101 in Peterborough.

Saturday September 24: Kidder Mountain Trail. It's been quite awhile since we had a workday on this side trail. Logging activity has altered the drainage and we plan on having the Trailwrights helping us install some water bars and other appurtenances. We'll meet at the NeWest Mall parking lot on Routes 123/124 in New Ipswich before heading over to the trailhead.

Saturday October 22: Pack Monadnock. This workday was originally scheduled for last fall but was postponed due to the need to relocate the trail at the summit of Temple Mountain. We'll be doing general trail maintenance including water bar work along the trail between the summit and the Cliff Trail. Meet at 8:30 in the parking lot at Miller State Park.

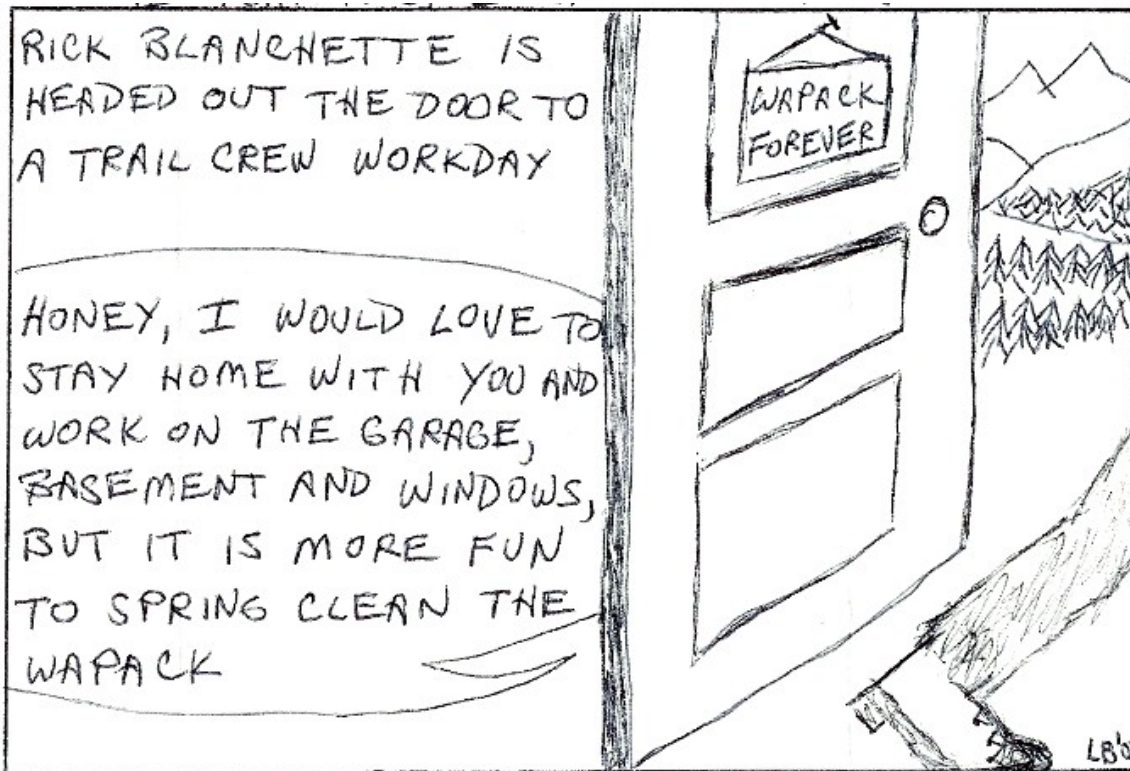

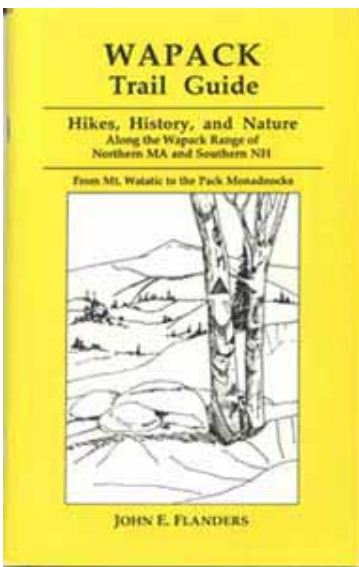

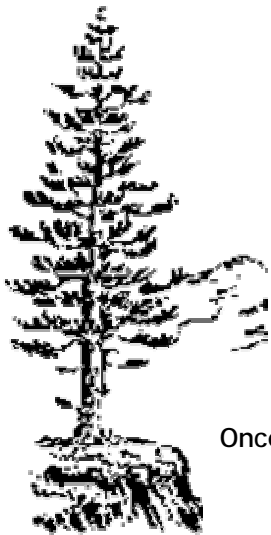
